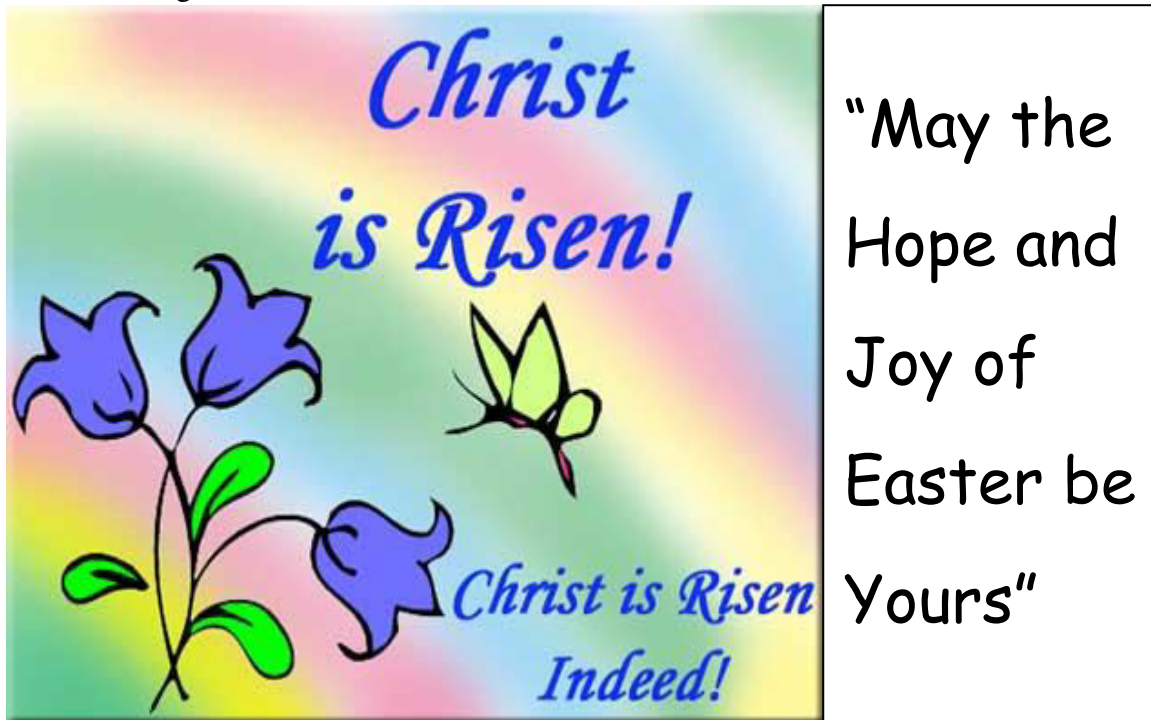

I have no words to thank Fr. Manjackal and Dr. Richi, his wife and his mother Gabi for what they have done for Fr. Thomas and for all of us. That is why I add below the letter Dr. Richi has written to me and all of us, giving us detailed information connected to Fr. Thomas' rehabilitation and treatment.

Letter from Dr. Richi

Praise the Lord! Halleluja!
God bless you, dear Fr. Matthew!

*My cherished brother, we are witnesses of the inextinguishable power of the infinite compassion and love of Our Lord. It is alone through the incredible guidance of His divine fatherly providence **that the joint efforts of the congregation of M.S.F.S. and of a few lovingly dedicated friends, including my mother, my wife and myself,** could fulfil the will of Our Heavenly Father and made it possible for Fr. Thomaskutty to receive the best thinkable treatment in a leading world class institution, the Guttmann Institute of Neurorehabilitation.*

*When we left India Fr. Thomaskutty was feeling weak, he was hardly able to sit, his hands were weak and he spoke very softly, so it was very difficult to hear him, it was impossible for him to accomplish the simplest necessities. The doctors in the Guttmann Institute have confirmed that Fr. Thomaskutty has a spinal lesion at the level of his chest, below this level no movement or sensation is possible, this includes his lower breathing muscles. **During the next months a multiprofessional team will help Fr. Thomaskutty learn how to dress and undress himself, he will be able to get on and off his wheelchair, he will learn how to live independently and do his physical necessities by himself. Furthermore, Fr. Thomaskutty will regain his voice, so he will be able to preach, and he will regain full control and strength in his hands making him able to celebrate mass and fulfil his duties, with a special wheelchair he will even be able to stand for mass and drive a car (a special one)! We were also very happy to know that the Guttmann Institute has the best "Wheelchair-Basketball" team in Spain and that many patients can do several kinds of sports while on a wheelchair! So by the grace of Our Lord, Fr. Thomaskutty will come back to India as a new man and a new priest!***

*I remember the days in which we were contacting each other innumerable times on the phone and by email, organizing, praying and trying to move heaven and earth to bring joy and hope into the life and suffering of one of God's anointed children. **It is true what you said, that only someone who is IN LOVE WITH JESUS can do such a thing, let me tell you that I am***

not the only one. I thank you dear Fr. Mathew, I thank you for your selfless help and unlimited support, I thank you for the encouragement and love with which you kept the flame of compassion alive in our hearts, please receive our gratitude and extend this to the bishop and the authorities involved as well **as to all your confreres in the M.S.F.S** who you so excellently managed and helped us greatly with their prayers and their deeds, specially Fr. Joseph Thayil and Fr. Johny. We alone would have never been able to accomplish such an enterprise successfully. It was with the help of Dr. Helene and Dr. Christoph from Salzburg that we could acquire the necessary equipment to transport Fr. Thomaskutty. My mother Gaby organized many Spanish friends to support this noble cause.

My special gratitude also goes to Fr. James Manjackal not only for his excellent moral support and blessed guidance, but also for his relentless encouragement - his loving words are still in my mind "Surrender to the Lord, never give up my son!" He is contacting sponsors and benefactors who today are ready, willing and eager to share the great blessings that come through such a wonderful deed. Fr. James Manjackal even went as far as compromising his own health and well being (he was suffering under a pneumonia), travelling to India and assailing the last grievous impediments to Fr. Thomaskutty's journey. As you well know we had great problems even to the very last moments, in which you called to receive the news that Qatar Airways didn't want to let us enter the plane. It was then that you lifted your heart to God, as Fr. James called the aprox. 500 people surrounding the ambulance to pray for our cause, at the same time my mother and my wife in Europe were awakened by the Spirit, unable to sleep and praying for us, here I see the great love of and concern of Fr. James for the members of the congregation (I and my family have the privilege of his love ever since we attended his retreat, he has a compassionate and loving heart). I remember the silent smile of Fr. Johny, the prayerful eyes of Fr. Joseph and the folded hands of the relatives and confreres of Fr. Thomaskutty and of all those around us, all I did is what any man would do, I took him into my arms and placed him on a wheelchair, to take him on the longest journey of his life until then. My task was nothing but that of a humble servant, simply to carry him, I did but the least - what kind of man would I be if wouldn't put all my abilities to the service of the One who created me and gave them to me in the first place? This was one of the moments in which the heavens touched the earth; the manager of Qatar Airways said he would only allow us to board the plane if the pilot would come and see the patient, but the pilot said "If a priest and a doctor are with him, then I don't need to see the patient, allow them on board!" and thus we could fly to Spain! We then had a wonderful and very comfortable trip to Barcelona, the stewardesses and ground staff took care of us like angels.

Beloved Fr. Mathew, it is a privilege for all the involved to take part in such a blessed and anointed deed, I thank you once again for believing in us and helping us fight for a better future in the life and ministry of Fr. Thomaskutty, I am sure that beyond our words and feelings of gratitude Our Father in heaven is looking down upon us with wisdom and love filling the measure of glory, blessings and grace we are to receive on the day of His coming. Please be assured that I will do the utmost to be present wherever you may be in Germany when you come in order of having the wonderful honour of meeting you. Please pray for me and my family that we may live an authentic Christian life, and that my youngest son James may receive a religious vocation to be a priest like our Fr. James.

Orientation Course in Saumya Sadan

My Visitation to Chad-Cameroon Mission

From the 13th of February to the 6th of March I had the privilege of being with the confreres in Chad-Cameroon Mission. It was a very positive and encouraging experience for me to see the confreres committed fully to various ministries entrusted to them. By our commitment to apostolate beyond the boundaries of our own countries and cultures we take seriously the mission mandate of Jesus “Go to the whole world and preach the Gospel to the whole of creation” (Mk.16.15). I deeply felt that in our Chad-Cameroon Mission we are faithfully following the Apostolate Overseas and Pioneering Evangelization as enshrined in the constitution. “We strive to proclaim the Gospel with eagerness and enthusiasm in areas where it is not yet proclaimed and Where the Church is not yet implanted.” (Constitution Art. 32) The continent of Africa is the most fertile field for the Word of God today. Scholastics Scaria, Paul Raj, Periyannayagam, Giridhari, Maria Lawrence and Sandeep were staying with the Sacred Heart Fathers and Manoj, Gijo, Boban, Robin, Kuldeep and our Scholastics from Cameroon, Innocent and Bonaventure were staying in the rented house “Maison Pierre Mermier” at Nkollbisson, Yaoundé. The house at Nkollbisson was known as the “house of Dust” and the confreres were living in unhealthy surroundings. Earlier a few scholastics were staying with the Lazarists. I know that the community will be happy to be together in the newly constructed house.

Fr Thomas Cherukat is temporarily appointed as the Rector and Fr. Martin Richard the Procurator. I would like to thank Fr. Thomas Cherukat for his unreserved commitment and his vision for the Chad-Cameroon Mission. He bought the land, (now getting it registered in the name of the Society,) and constructed a beautiful and spacious house. Surely he had a lot of struggle to get the finances organized, but he has done it in a wonderful way. I make use of this opportunity also to thank Fr. Mayoraz and the Franco-Swiss Province for their generous contribution towards this purpose. Please remember our mission especially on 10th April.

A great day for SFS TTI, Kolar!

On 12th March 2007, the first fruit of **Paper Craft and Note Book Making Technology Course** was brought to light by Provincial Rev. Fr. Mathew Kozhuppakalam by handing over the first note book to Fr. Erudayaraja the Councilor in-charge of Education. The event took place amidst the gathering of all the educationists of South West Province. The provincial highlighted the purpose of this new venture. Besides providing books for our schools, TTI gives employment for some rural youth. The profits accruing out of this undertaking will come to a central scholarship fund for poor children and marginalized youth. SFS TTI is sure to produce and supply note books for all our schools in Karnataka, and it is on the way of improvement, and self sustenance with its income.

Besides the existing courses in Electricals, Electronics, and Computer Hardware, TTI has also started **Driving and Automobile Mechanism Course** for the rural youth in Karnataka. The programme began with 5 trainees on 24th March 2007. Training is given in expert driving, basic automobile mechanism, general etiquette, personality development and spoken English. They will be trained to get a driving job in the corporate sector or in religious houses. SFS TTI, Kolar is also in fast pursuit to begin its **Fashion Technology Course** in near future. We dream of activating our carpentry and welding section, starting courses in Printing Technology, Secretarial Training, Diesel Engine Mechanics, and similar courses that will be of use to the rural and marginalized youth.

On 25th March,2007 a one day spiritual renewal programme for the youth was conducted in Kolar denary. The programme was conducted in Malayalam at St. Mary’s Church, Kolar. Fr.
