My dear Confreres,



I wish you, at the outset, a very Happy Feast of Our Lady of Compassion, the Patroness of our Congregation and a Blessed day of the Death Anniversary of our beloved Founder, Servant of God Fr. Peter Marie Mermier! The month of September is something special for the Missionaries of St. Francis de Sales as these two important events that are very close to the heart of all the members coincide. Our Constitutions, in Art. No. 10 elucidate the reason for our Founder to choose Mother of Compassion as our heavenly Patroness: “To be closer to the Crucified Christ, through a life of complete surrender and total dedication to the Father’s will and to be more ready to suffer the consequences of standing for the values of the Kingdom of love, justice, peace and reconciliation, our Founder presents Mary, the Mother of

Sorrows/Compassion as the Patroness of our Congregation”. I entreat every confrere of the Province to prepare spiritually by praying the Novena to Mother of Compassion and also the Novena to our Founder for a renewal of our religious and missionary consecration.



This year the Founder’s day is something special for us as it marks the 150th Death Anniversary of Fr. Peter Marie Mermier. Our Founder’s spirit and vision is recaptured in the Art. No. 4 of our Constitutions: “I have totally dedicated myself to the work of the missions, to the sublime ministry of Jesus Christ who is the first missionary and leader in every mission”. Our vision for this double Jubilee Year was well articulated by the General Chapter 2013: It is three fold – to be missionaries absorbing the Fransalian heritage of our Founder and of our pioneering missionaries, to be Mystics of God’s love by deeply rooted in Salesian spirituality and to be Prophets who will embrace the voice of God and the vision of the Congregation. I wish and pray that this Jubilee Year be a blessing for all the MSFS to renew ourselves in the pioneering missionary spirit of our early fathers!

My Visitation of Chad-Cameroon Mission

I made the official visitation of Chad-Cameroon Mission from the 11th of July to 6th of August, 2013. I visited all the centres of our Mission, met all the confreres and animated the



Mission Colloquium for the sharing and planning of future activities of the mission. It was a spiritually enriching experience for me personally and I believe it was the same for the confreres in the Chad-Cameroon Mission too. The visitation was meticulously planned by Fr. Joshy Nellimalamattam, the Mission Superior and he accompanied me to each and every mission station personally. I take this opportunity to thank him and to place on record the untiring efforts he had made in making this visitation a fruitful one. Chad-Cameroon Mission

is taking definite shape and it is geared towards stabilization. This year we had two new ordinations and after three more years we will have steady ordinations every year. We have two missions in Chad – Bero and Doba. Four of our fathers are working there – Fr. Sandeep Tirkey and Fr. Christoph, with Bro. Boris at Bero; Fr. Scaria and Fr. Robin at Doba. Bero is the first mission of the South West Province in Central Africa. Doba was taken up later. The religious climate in the Diocese of Doba, where our fathers are working, is in turmoil right now. The bishop was expelled by the Chad Government on the accusation that he spoke against the Chad Government. We have well established missions started by the Combonian fathers, consisting of parishes with several mission stations, schools and boys' home. Our continuity in Chad depends on the new bishop and how the religious scenario evolves in the Diocese of Doba.

Our Mission in Cameroon is really flourishing. In the Diocese of Ngaoundéré the King has



gifted us with a good plot of land and we are beginning our Minor Seminary, a School and a clinic in collaboration with women religious congregations. Two of our fathers are engaged in the pastoral activities, both in the University of Ngaoundéré and in two parishes - Fr. Giridhari is the pastor in charge of University chaplaincy and Fr. Bipin Xess is the parish priest. This can be one of the permanent presences of the MSFS in Cameroon and the bishop is very welcoming and supportive. In the


Archdiocese of Yaoundé we have one of the most promising parishes, that of Ekoundoum. Two of our fathers are working there – Fr. Boban Elanjimattathil is the superior and Asst. Parish Priest and Fr. Joshy Nellimalamattam is the parish priest. The parish church construction is near completion and this church is a mini basilica which is constructed with the help of the people and by the untiring efforts of our confreres. This parish consists of very educated and influential people who support the MSFS and many form part of *Friends of Fransalians*. Within the territory of this parish, we have a plot of land which is apt for a

school and we are beginning a school there this year. We have also another four acres of land in the vicinity of this parish, where there is scope for another school.

In the Diocese of Obala we have our Major Seminary, La Feuillette, situated and we have a permanent parish entrusted to our care at Ekkekam. Fr. Manoj Arackal is the Rector of the Seminary and the Parish Priest at Ebang. Under the parish of Ekkekam there are two plots of land for us and we are planning to have a school and a dispensary there for the people. Fr. Marcel and Fr. Parfait serve this parish at present. Fr. Mathew Kavithazhe has taken up one of the most remote and challenging missions in our Chad-Cameroon Mission. The place is called Kokabouma, it is in the Anglophone area of Cameroon and the access to this mission is a serious problem. The people are very cooperative and Fr. Mathew is fully engaged in the construction of the new Church there and in the building up of the parish community. Fr. Thomas Moongamackal is designated as the University chaplain at Bouya, which is again in the Anglophone area of Cameroon and it is the oldest diocese in Cameroon. Fr. Gijo Panamattam is at Arusha, serving the Philosophate and preparing for his studies. Fr. Kuldeep Kujur is appointed as Socius at Kibaha in Tanzania.

In our Mission Colloquium, we had a very meaningful sharing and planning regarding the future of our Chad-Cameroon Mission. Two of our newly ordained priests will soon take up their B.Ed studies and Fr. Emile is pursuing his MTh studies at IIS, India. Two more confreres from Chad-Cameroon will go to Germany for pastoral ministry in order to support the future Delegation financially. In my visitation of Franco-Swiss Province in January-February 2014 we will arrive at concrete plans for the financial support of Chad-Cameroon Mission. After lengthy and in-depth sharing and discussion, it was unanimously proposed in the Mission Colloquium to raise Chad-Cameroon Mission into a Delegation.

Blessing of the Newly Constructed Chapel at Atmajyothi Retreat Centre, Pattikkad



The newly constructed chapel at Atmajyothi Retreat Centre, Pattikkad was blessed by Rev. Fr. Jose Kumbloickal, the Provincial, on July 7, 2013. Fr. Tomy Pulimthanam, the Director of the centre, welcomed the invitees. The occasion was solemnized by the presence of many MSFS Confreres, Priests from the Diocese, Religious sisters, neighbours and benefactors. Rev. Fr. Jose Kumbloickal, the Provincial, congratulated the Director, Fr. Tomichen and the

Procurator, Fr. Devasia Koottarappallil for their tireless efforts in materializing this dream project and for their team work. He also thanked the group of collaborators at Atmajyothi for the wonderful apostolate of Renewal of Christian life done at the Centre and in the neighbouring parishes. In his message he highlighted the importance of our Prayer Centre and its activities. At present Atmajyothi Retreat Centre caters to the spiritual empowerment of the faithful by way of organising regular residential retreats, family retreats, evening convention and counselling. The programme came to an end with the agape meal.

A Short Report on Mission Colloquium, Chad-Cameroon



The Chad-Cameroon Mission had two mission colloquiums in this year 2013. The first one took place in the month of March, 2013 during the visitation of Rev. Fr. Abraham Vettuvellil, our Superior General. And the second one took place on 22nd July, 2013. Though the meeting was foreseen for two days, the discussions came to an end by the first day itself. All the confreres were present except Fr. Scaria Kannezhath and Fr.

Thaveethu Paulraj. The meeting was presided over by Rev. Fr. Jose Kumblolickal, the Provincial Superior of the South West India Province. The confreres shared the life in the mission centres, presented plans and visions for all the units. There were special sessions on Financial Planning, Ongoing Formation of Confreres and Opening of New Centres in the Mission. Discussions were held also on how to make the Mission self sufficient and how to improve the functioning and administration. After sufficient and mature discussion on the question whether to raise the status of the Mission into a Delegation under South West India Province or not, the members unanimously voted in favour of raising the Mission into a Delegation. The Mission Colloquium came to an end with the thanksgiving Holy Hour Adoration, the first Mass of the new priests and the group photo.

One of the Action Plan of the Provincial Congress 2013 was to revive the Boys' Home in Chintamani. Due attention has been paid to it and the Boys' Home is in full function now. We have this year sixteen boys and the Director and Principal at Chintamani give sufficient attention to improve the infrastructure and facilities to the boys. This boys' home is part of our pastoral plan for Karnataka that we cater to poor Catholic boys in our mission in Karnataka to educate them and support them to find a job in their lives. I thank our Frs. AC Arokianathan and Prasanth Kumar at Chintamani for the keen interest they have shown in reviving the Boys' Home and attending to the over-all needs of the boys.

Schools' Contribution for Chad-Cameroon Mission

It was also one of the resolutions of the Provincial Congress that we continue to support our Chad-Cameroon Mission, especially with our collaboration through schools in the Province in India. Accordingly an *Africa Day* was held in all our Schools and the annual collection of last year is Rs. 2,91,525. I earnestly enjoin all the principals of our schools and colleges to hold the *Africa Day* this year with appropriate theme and exhibition, inculcating in the students a sense of solidarity with our mission in Africa. I thank all the principals and managers of our schools and colleges for their whole-hearted cooperation and support.

ID Card from the Archdiocese

The Archdiocese of Bangalore has made it obligatory that all the priests, religious and diocesans, working within the Archdiocese to furnish their personal data to the Archdiocesan office for issuing ID cards to the fathers. 
