My Dear Confreres,

The 19th ordinary General Chapter 2013 of our Congregation has elected Fr. Abraham Vettuvellil as our 14th Superior General. Together with the entire Congregation we as a Province family rejoice at it. We thank God and pray, that God may strengthen him every moment to lead our Congregation in its life and mission. We shall assure him our constant support through prayer and fraternal collaboration.

Fr. Abraham Vettuvellil was installed as the Fourth Provincial of our Province on 11 June 2011. His appointment as the Provincial was received by the Province-community with much joy and hope. For the past 19 months he has been actively involved in the life and mission of the province enabling us to grow in our consecration and missionary commitment. He did exhort and inspire the confreres to live our life with clarity and deeper sense of commitment. His life was an inspiration for everyone. Abraham as our new Superior General. His election was a clear expression of the working of the Spirit in and through the Capitulants for the life and Mission of the Congregation. It took some time for the province community to understand his election as the Superior General in the providential plan of God for the entire Congregation as the Province was gearing up its personnel, material and spiritual resources for greater commitment under his Leadership. I may not be misunderstood if I say that the members of South West India Province received the news of his selection with much joy and at the same time with a sense of loss, as he would not be our Provincial.

My dear Confreres:



2. Blessed Holy Week and Happy Easter

We are coming to the close of the Lenten season in preparation for the great feast of the Church. Let us have the person of Jesus clearly before us these days. These days, in the liturgy of the Word, we have a picture of Jesus standing alone not accepted and not

appreciated. Each of the four gospels presents Jesus finally standing alone; rejected, misunderstood, defeated, abandoned, betrayed, arrested and nailed to the cross, and then resurrected. How is it that Jesus is all alone toward the end without much support and understanding from the people? Where is the crowd? Where are the Apostles and the disciples?

Perhaps no one really comprehended what he was talking about when he taught with successive metaphors about the 'Rule of God'. Finally, Jesus realizes that he has to do the teaching visually and personally in his body, and not orally. That is the reason he stopped talking about his mission toward the end of the gospel and he then allowed it to happen. This is what we mean when we say that Jesus had to die for us. It was not that Jesus had to literally pay God some price by shedding blood and dying on the Cross to make God feel good. This has been the understanding of various religions for many years: We humans have to spill blood to get to God, but after the 'Christ event', we are able to know that God actually spills blood to get to us.



We are also challenged in our mission and ministries as MSFS to teach visually and personally through our body. Our willingness to work in challenging missions of the Province outside our own culture, our openness to embrace ministries that do not offer securities in life, our readiness to opt for pioneering and overseas missions, our missionary spirit in putting up with inconveniences and hardships in

places of our ministry are some of the ways we can proclaim 'Rule of God' visually and personally. Let us be more visual and personal in our missionary life. May the suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus be the model in our missionary spirituality! Wish you all a happy Easter!

7. Mission Sangamam



On January 16th and 17th, 2013, Ettumanoor Apostolic Community organized Mission Sangamam, in honour of late Rev. Fr. George Vayalil MSFS, the pioneer and promoter of missionary movement from Syro-Malabar Church in Kerala. The Sangamam was attended by Fransalian missionaries from all over the world. It was a fitting tribute to the man who envisioned something new and adventurous for the Lord, broke the boundaries of culture, language, and rite to respond to the challenging call of missions.

The Sangamam that began at the tomb of Fr. George Vayalil with prayers, intercessions and symbolic lighting of lamp progressed through thought provoking and scholarly presentations from distinguished speakers. Eminent Guests who graced the occasion were Mar George Cardinal Alenchery, Major Archbishop of Syro- Malabar Church, Mar Joseph Powathil, president of Inter-Church Council of Kerala, Rt. Rev. Dr. Sebastian Thekkethecheril, Bishop of Vijayapuram, Provincials, Regional Superiors, and former Provincials. Archbishop Mar Joseph Powathil inaugurated the Mission Sangamam. In the inaugural address, Archbishop Powathil explored the missionary contributions of Syro-Malabar Church to the global church. Rev. Fr. Abraham Vettuvellil, the provincial of South West Province delivered the keynote address. Scholarly presentations interlaced with missionary and personal experiences of veteran missionaries who were associated with Rev. Fr. George Vayalil of happy memory, kept the participants spellbound. Presentations by Rev. Frs. Antony Mookenthottam MSFS, Jacob Parappally MSFS, Jose Parappillil MSFS, Kuncheria Pathil CMI, Tom Kochery CSSR and panel discussion highlighted the magnitude of difficulties and struggles faced by the veteran missionaries of the past and the present challenges to missionaries to be effective in their missions. Message of Mar George Cardinal Alenchery, Major Archbishop of Syro-Malabar Church was on the challenges of new evangelization for missionaries in the context of the growing realities of materialism that depletes missionary fervour and single minded devotion to missionary activities. The Mission Sangamam concluded with thanksgiving Eucharist presided over by Rt. Rev. Sebastian Thekkethecheril, Bishop of Vijayapuram. It was an opportune time for all the participants to fan the flame of missionary zeal and enthusiasm and move in the right direction and focus on new evangelization to be effective in the missions. Rev. Fr. Devasia Kuzhupil MSFS (25.07.1924 – 12.01.2013)



Fr. Devasia Kuzhupil was born on July 25, 1924 at Athirampuzha, Kerala. After his primary schooling at St. Aloysius School, Athirampuzha (1930-1934) and High School at St. Ephrem’s High School, Mannanam (1934-1942), he joined the St. Joseph’s Mission Home, Vijayapuralayam, Thiruvalla (1942-44). He had his philosophical studies at St. Joseph’s Apostolic Seminary, Mangalapuzha (1944-47) and made his first profession on May 5, 1948 at St. Anne’s Cathedral, Visakhapatnam. After the Novitiate he came back to St. Joseph’s Apostolic Seminary, Mangalapuzha for his theological studies. He made his Final Vows on May 5, 1951. He was ordained priest on March 16, 1952 at St. Mary’s Forane Church, Athirampuzha by Bishop Dr. Ambrose Absolo of Vijayapuram. He was the Assistant Vicar of Salur Mission and later Parish Priest of Salur Makkuwa Mission. He was appointed as Regional Superior of Visakhapatnam from 1962-65 and later as Provincial from 1965-70. From 1971-78 he was the Superior of Anantpur Mission. He was Novice Master for one year. From 1979-81 he was the Regional Superior of North East India Province. He was superior of SFS Press, Visakhapatnam (1981-83) and was in Palasa Mission (1983-90). During his stay in Charis Bhavan (1991-2013) as Superior he remained a constant source of inspiration for the Congregation as well as the people around.

Demise of Rev. Fr. Devasia Kuzhupil is a loss for the Congregation especially for the South West India Province and for Chairs Bhavan Retreat centre. On 15th afternoon the body of Fr. kuzhupil was brought to St. Mary’s Forane church Athirampuzha, his home parish and was kept there from 3pm to 4 pm for the public to pay homage and prayers. By 4.30 pm the body was brought to Charis Bhavan and was kept in the convention hall, which was specially prepared for the funeral of the co- founder of Charis Bhavan. From then thousands came to pay their last homage to their dear ‘Valiachan’. The funeral service of Fr. KUZHUPIL was on 16th January 10. 30 a.m. Rt. Rev. Dr. Sebastian Thekethecheril presided over the Eucharistic Celebration and Mar Mathew Moolakkatt,

the Archbishop of Kottayam led the funeral rites. Confreres from various Provinces, great number of other priests and religious and a large crowd attended the funeral of Fr. Devasia Kuzhupil. He was laid to rest at Charis Bhavan, Athirampuzha.

Rev. Fr. Lourance Thadathil of East Africa Province passed away on January 8, 2013. He was 34 years old.

Rev. Fr. François COFFY, born on February 2, 1921 of Franco Swiss Province passed away on January 27, 2013, at Thonon hospital. He was a religious and a priest for 65 years. His ministries led him to Bourogne (teacher minor seminary 1949-1959), Philippeville parish in Algeria (1959-1978), Paris (1978-1995) in different parishes and Les Allinges (local superior, assistant parish priest 1996-2005). He was then admitted in a nursing home for senior citizens at Thonon.

Rev. Fr. Alan Blackford of English Province passed away on February 25, 2013. He was 85 years old.

Rev. Bro. Joseph Thekkumthottam of Visakhapatnam Province passed away on March 11, 2013. He was 84 years old.

Rev. Fr. Nicolas DESBOEUF of Franco Swiss Province born on November 2, 1939 passed away on March 19, 2013. He was a religious since 1960 and a priest since 1966. He was very active in diverse youth movements, especially the JEC (Catholic Christian Students); he has been world chaplain of this Movement 1991-1994. At Geneva, he was chaplain of the main prison of the city for about 10 years.

Mr. Nellimalamattam Mathew father of Fr. Joshy Nellimalamattam, passed away on January 30, 2013.

Mr. Kunnathottel Mathew, father of Fr. Viju Kunnathottel passed away on March 15, 2013.
